CREATION OF PEER APPROACH IN CONURBANT



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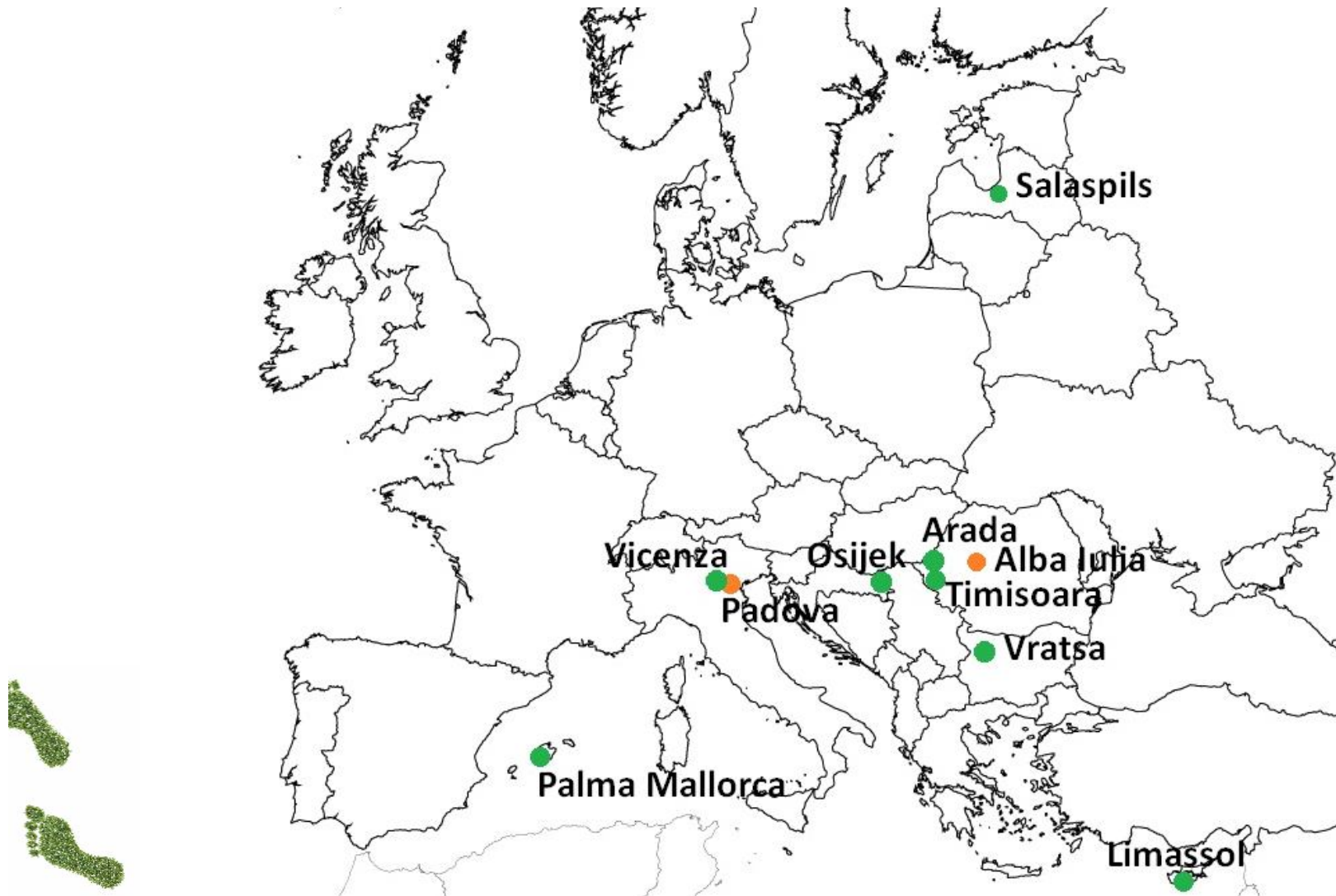
The matrix of Conurbant





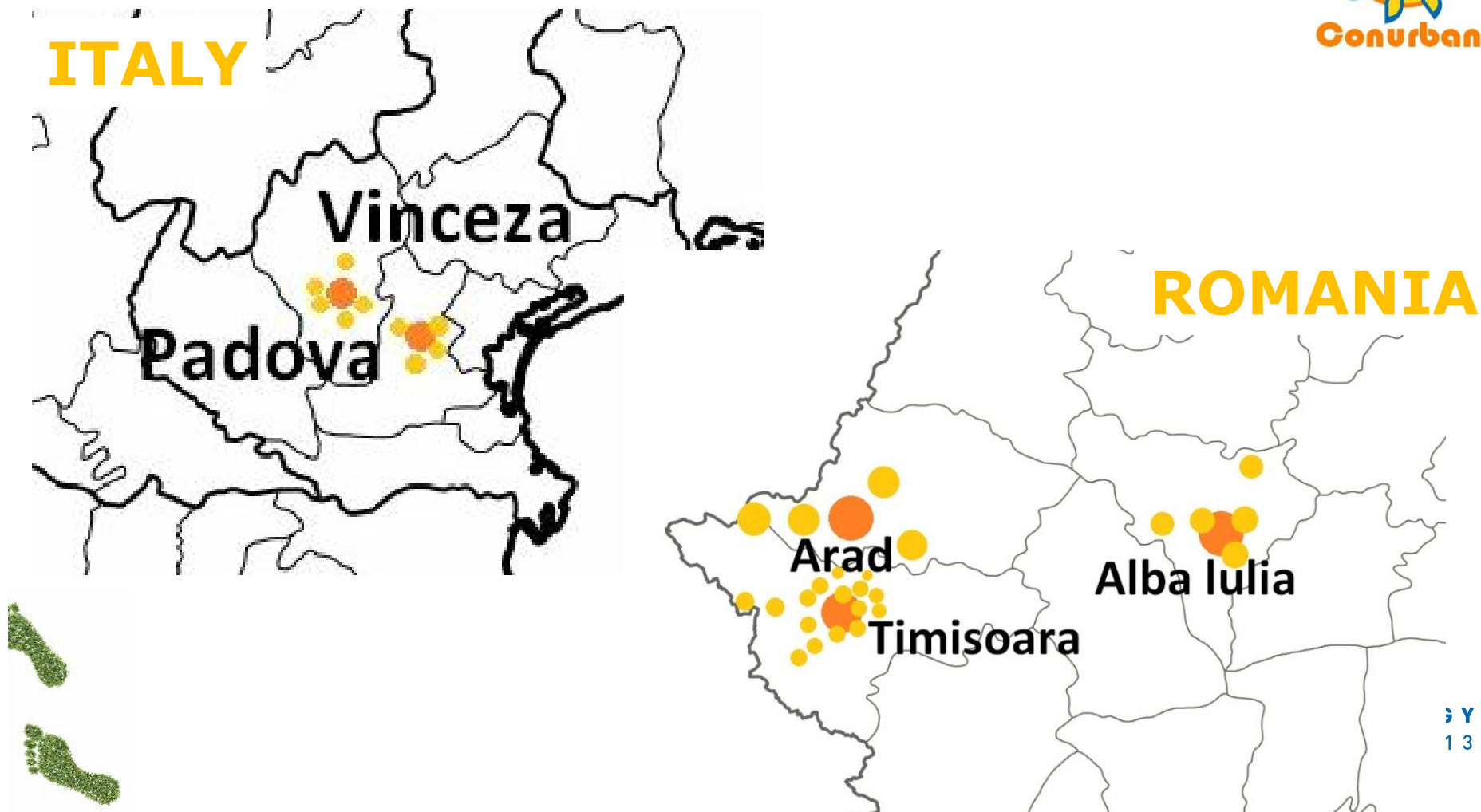
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1st level - Tutor and Trainee municipalities

An example of Energy forums

- Part of the SEAP development to involve society
- Energy forums organised based on the IEE project BELIEF
- We played out a role game with selection of the topics, moderator, municipality, society etc.
- Locally implemented by partners



Lessons learned from the trainings

- Good technical material from different projects for partners was collected and provided
- Centralised-local training approach was a great possibility to share the knowledge however not always the right people participated
- Partners were given possibility to see the best practice examples which suited well for inspiration
- More interactive discussions could have improved the results so as better planning (the 'warm up' was needed)

Check list (1/2)

- 10 blocks of questions to check
- The objective of the check list is to allow municipalities to focus on:
 - the development of the SEAP,
 - implementation of the measures to identify the main drivers and barriers and
 - also on monitoring
- Check list is based on CoM guidelines and different IEE projects
- The twin pairs tested it for the first time in the phase when municipalities are finalising their SEAPs and planning implementation activities

Lessons learned from peer-to-peer

- municipalities learn from each other however clear indication should be created and given
- municipalities can identify their weak points and they should be given also possibilities to improve
- SEAPs sometimes are made only for shelves and there is need of motivated person in the municipality to change it
- best ideas for this task come a bit late
